Celebrating Freedom: July 4, 1776 – The adoption of our Declaration of Independence

I'm not a historian, but I'm a big fan of America, freedom, and Google where I gleaned all the facts noted in this article.

We lived 168 years under British rule 1607 to 1783

The American Revolution Era was 1763 - 1783

April 19, 1775, fighting began at Lexington and Concord

By February of 1776, colonial leaders were discussing the possibility of independence.

On June 7, 1776, Richard Henry Lee introduced a motion in the Second Continental Congress to declare independence, and a 5-member committee was appointed to draft the Declaration of Independence.

On July 2, 1776, independence was formally declared by vote of the Congress and the draft of the Declaration of Independence, which had been primarily written by Thomas Jefferson, was submitted for review. Members of Congress made 86 changes to the draft and shortened the overall length by more than 25%. Philosopher John Locke's ideas were an important influence on the Declaration of Independence. Jefferson restated Locke's contract theory of government when he wrote in the Declaration that governments derived "their just Powers from the consent of the people."

On July 4, 1776, the Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence.

On August 2, 1776, the revised and approved Declaration of Independence was signed.

The 1783 Treaty of Paris ended the War of the American Revolution, and Great Britain finally recognized U.S. independence.

Hi everyone!

I hope you are getting ready to enjoy the upcoming July 4th holiday. Like much of the country, it's been hot at HP with daytime highs much above normal. Heat indexes have reached well into the 100's.

June finished with adequate rain fall, but much less than surrounding areas. The tropics have been quiet so far, but a new area of concern may be developing.

With the hot humid conditions, the summer weed machine is working overtime. With last fall's mulch showing its age, and Everyday Maintenance spraying weekly, weeds still seem to pop up overnight. It's almost an insurmountable problem that will continue to be addressed.

May and June were quiet landscaping months. July will be more active as the project planting will begin after the Independents Day holiday. That includes summer annuals in the marquee planter and continuation of lake side lanai renovations. Our next property trimming will also take place in July. This month the ARC will answer the question "Is it okay to plant personal plants, or place potted plants, outside my unit?"

The answer is no, you may not plant or place potted plants outside your unit. You MAY, however, have plants inside your lanai or screen enclosed entry area. The reason for not allowing personal plants outside your unit is to maintain a uniform, uncluttered look on our common grounds. Additionally, we have a contracted landscaping company that provides and maintains all of the plantings outside the buildings.

- Air Conditioner & Heating Replacement (includes either the entire unit, air handler only or condenser only)
- Entrance Enclosure (Screen doors)
- Entrance & Lanai Flooring (material & color)
- Indoor Hard Surface Flooring mainly sound proofing material
- Windows or Doors Replacement
- Lanai Sunscreens / Fabric or Metal Shutters
- Lanai Murals
- Entrance & Storage Door Hardware
- Window Coverings
- Material Alteration to Unit Interior
